An Overview: The National Trails System Act

- Signed by President Lyndon B. Johnson on October 2, 1968
- In conjunction with the Wild and Scenic Rivers Act
- Appalachian and Pacific Crest National Scenic Trails
- National Recreation Trails
- National Historic Trails 1978
- Rail Banking Authority







Goals of the 50th Anniversary

- Inspire the next generation of trails stewards and advocates
- Increase public engagement with and enjoyment of America's trails
- Increase government and private funding support for America's trails





Objectives of the 50th Anniversary

- Increase awareness of trails and the National Trails System among all Americans
- Inspire younger generations through new media to become trail users and supporters
- Connect Americans to trails physically and emotionally
- Increase engagement with trail activities, stewardship, and protection



NATIONAL TRAILS SYSTEM TRAILS

The National Trails System Act of 1968 established National Scenic Trails and National Recreation Trails and in 1978 President Carter signed into law a bill that created National Historic Trails.

As the Act stands today, as amended, National Scenic Trails are described as extended trails of more than 100 miles in length that provide for outdoor recreation and "for the conservation and enjoyment of the nationally significant scenic, historic, natural, or cultural qualities of the areas through which such trails may pass." National Scenic Trails may only be land-based, necessarily excluding any water-based travel routes. These trails may only be designated and authorized by an Act of Congress.

The centennial will kick off a second century of stewardship of America's national parks and engaging communities through recreation, conservation, and historic preservation programs.








