



The Partnership for the National Trails System, in collaboration with the Bureau of Land Management, National Park Service, and U.S. Forest Service, is pleased to announce grant recipients for their 2022 National Trails System Intern Grants. The Intern Grants create opportunities for young adults to become involved, or further their involvement, with our national trails while strengthening the capacity of the organizations and agencies that administer and manage the national scenic and historic trails.

**Thirteen grants totaling \$100,000 were awarded in 2022.** These grants will be matched with over \$172,000 of in-kind contributions and over \$178,300 in both partner non-Federal cash funds and other Federal funds.
